

- **Get the command form** of the following verbs and do the proper Tashkeel. Memorize the vocab.
- To demonstrate the procedure, we will be using the following example:
You^{3+M} plant the flowers^{3+F}.
 1. Using rule 610, row 8, column 3, (610,8,3), You^{3+M} is “أَنْتُمْ”. This step is optional because you may just say “Plant the flowers”.
 2. Using Arabic-English dictionary, the word “plant” is “زَرَعَ”, which is the root of the past tense verb. Note that the root of the past tense verb is for “He”. (1130, 10, 3), shows the root of the verb, which is “فَعَلَ”.
 3. The sounding of “زَرَعَ” is “فَعَلَ”.
 4. (1130, 8, 6) shows that the command tense of “You^{3+M}” is “إِفْعَلُوا”, the equivalent is “إِزْرَعُوا”.
 5. Using Arabic-English dictionary, the word “the flowers^{3+F}” is “الْوَرْدَاتِ”. Reason for the Kara is because the word “flowers^{3+F}” is the object. The object is Mansob Rule 1050. Mansob for 3+F is Kasra (290,6,5). No Tanwin for the word flowers because of the Alif-Lam (285-1).
 6. Combining the words together gives “أَنْتُمْ إِزْرَعُوا الْوَرْدَاتِ”

شَرَبَ	Drank (1M) root
يَشْرَبُ	Drinks (1F)
لَبَنٌ	Milk (1M, 1F, 2M, 2F, 3+M, 3+F)
زَرَعَ	Planted (1M) root
يُزْرَعُ	Plants (1M)
وَرْدَاتٌ	Flowers (3+F)

Words in **blue color** mean that they are optional.
