Arabic Language Grammar Rules.

The Verb Sentence:

الجُمْلَةُ الْفِعْلِيَةُ

Rule (600): The verb sentence starts with a verb.

Rule (610): The verb sentence is made of the following

Verb + Subject + Object بِهْ Verb + Subject + Object [or] Verb + Object + Subject فِعْلْ + مَفْعُولٌ بِهْ + فَاعِلْ

<u>Rule (620):</u> The subject is either a noun or pronoun and it is always Marbo^ (مَـرْفُـوُعْ)

<u>Rule (630):</u> The object is either a noun or pronoun and it is always Mansoob (مَـنْصُوُبْ)

<u>Rule (640)</u>: Both the subject and object can be nouns or pronouns. You can tell the difference between them by determining which one is Marfo[^] and which one is Mansoob.

Rule (650): The verb can be either one of the following:
